• How long have you been sailing?

I started sailing already as a kid in the age of six, with my parents. Anyhow I never made the traditional journey via dinghy sailing to keel boats – but we started directly on a bigger keel boat, which we owned with some colleagues of my dad.

Sail racing came into the picture about 12 years ago when I started offshore racing in Germany with a brilliant team with whom we won several championships.

• Can you tell us more about your crew and how did you determine who will be part of your crew for the Horsburgh Challenge?

To race a sailing boat of the size of Born in Fire you need a crew of seven.

It is sometimes difficult to get seven people on board, even if we have a crew pool of more than 20 sailors.

As COVID basically grounded everyone in Singapore the situation was a bit easier throughout the last year, and we could build up a very consistent team of four to five sailors, which sailed most of the races with the boat throughout 2020. Nonetheless we added in three crewmembers which normally do not sail with us. They are all experienced offshore sailors and were very much attracted by the idea to sail the Horsburgh Challenge – while other of the team stepped out due to the long distance and the early start.

• How many times you and your crew joined the Horsburgh Challenge in the past few years?

This year was my third Horsburgh Challenge, in 2019 I participated with this years winner Invictus, and last year as well with Born in Fire but in the IRC class, which was not racing this year, due to too little boats opting for IRC.

• What did you and your team do to prepare for the Horsburgh Challenge?

We had a full weekend training for the Commodores Cup (a race organised by Changi Sailing Club) and the Horsburgh Challenge, where we mainly trained manoeuvres, kite sets and drops as well as mark roundings.

Further we met on the Thursday prior the race and discussed some options, positions and possible courses, which then unfortunately were not used, due to the change of course.

• Any interesting/challenging experience that happened during any of the races?

One thing is surely the excitement on the evening prior the race, you know you have to get up early and everything must be perfect, especially when you go offshore, so you need to think things through more often and be 100% sure everything is in perfect shape.

On the other hand, you know you have to get up at 04:00 to be at the club in time, get the boat ready and pass immigration and be in time on the starting

line. The lack of sleep on a 7-10 hour race is truly a challenge.

Apart from that, racing in the waters around Singapore is always interesting, as you have a lot of traffic from commercial ships, which are either following the Traffic Separation Scheme or which are anchored, or entering the port not to talk about the tidal streams which really can be a game changer. This give you multiple opportunities to get things wrong and the tactics really need to be on their toes, not to sail into wind shadows, or to tack too often.

• Any words of encouragement for people who want to try their hand at sailing?

Wow, there are many words,... I guess the pages won't last.

For me it is the passion of my life, it even encouraged me to start my professional career as a naval architect.

It is a beautiful sport, you are out on the water, in the wind, surrounded by people who share the same passion and love for the sea – people who quickly turn into a team and friends.

You have the chance to learn multiple things, like trimming, navigating, tactics, helming,.... And it's a great, and always friendly competition.

But sailing is more than racing just racing and competition, a boat also provides you with the opportunity to go somewhere and enjoy the beautiful ocean and nature we are living in.

Step on board, and try it out – there are many boats in Singapore who are eager to have more crewmembers joining and everyone is happy to help you get better.

See you on the water!



At my first regatta at NSC Cup 3 2019, I lost my cap on the last race day and missed the horn at the start of the race. As a result, I had a bad start and continued to do badly for the subsequent races of the day as I kept my eyes peeled for my lost cap.

Are you into other sports besides sailing? If yes, what are they?

Yes, I enjoy playing soccer with my friends, and swimming and cycling with my family

How do you manage sailing around your curriculum of studies?

l always try to complete my homework in school and do revision whenever I have pockets of time.

For you, what makes a good sailor?

To me, a good sailor is one who pays attention to what the coaches teach and takes every training session seriously. A good sailor is also one with integrity and respects his or her peers and coaches.

What are your personal goals in terms of sailing? To represent Singapore one day.

Any regattas you are looking forward to participating in this year? How do you prepare yourself for the competition?

I am looking forward to the Singapore National Youth Championship in March as it is my first gold fleet regatta. I prepare by sleeping early, being focused and reading through my sailing notes beforehand.

Achieving Mission Success as a Family

A submarine may be operated by a mere 28 crew but yet, it is one of the most lethal assets of the Republic of Singapore Navy (RSN). Stealthy and nimble, the RSN submarines are able to take down targets within minutes and stay undetected by adversaries. This month, we spoke to a submarine officer, MAJ Gabriel Tang, who is an ex-national sailor with the SAFYC, to find out more.

Share with us what sparked your interest in a career with the RSN?

My dad was a former Army officer. He is amongst the biggest inspiration in my life and he was my role model when I was growing up. Since young, I knew that I wanted to join the military.

I have always had an affinity with the sea. I joined the SAFYC when I was 10 and had started sailing since then. I eventually got into the national team and had the chance to sail for Singapore in international competitions. I chose the RSN because of this and have never looked back since.

Can you tell us more about the life and culture in the RSN?

I am currently an Operations Officer on board a submarine. As an Operations Officer, I lead my team in running the daily routine, operations and training of the entire submarine crew. I also lead the underwater sonar and weapons department in ensuring the combat effectiveness of the submarine.

Life in the RSN is challenging and dynamic – you get to serve in different roles and under different circumstances that will constantly challenge you and push you out of your comfort zone. You are also given the opportunity to grow as a leader as you will need to take charge of the people under you in order to achieve mission success.

The defining culture of the RSN is the family spirit. When we are deployed out at sea for long periods of time, we get to know everybody on board over time and develop close ties, and they become family. We look forward to coming to work and helping each other overcome challenges so as to achieve mission success as a team.

What is your most memorable experience in the RSN so far?

As a junior officer, I was given the incredible opportunity to plan for a bilateral exercise for my submarine. The exercise was fairly complex and stretched over several days. It was an antisubmarine exercise which involved an entire anti-submarine force up against a single submarine.

Halfway through the exercise, we had already snuck up close enough to threaten the force and captured some "periscope shots" to prove it. We were then told by our headquarters that the anti-submarine force could not locate us at all and requested for us to be detected in order to allow our bilateral partners to gain some training experience with our submarine. That was a very proud moment for me and my crew as we knew then that we had successfully achieved the mission despite the odds.

It was very fulfilling to see my planning come to fruition, and more importantly, the exercise showcased the combat capabilities of the RSN submarine force and we were able to fly Singapore's flag high.

What do you find fulfilling in your everyday work?

The most fulfilling portion of my everyday work is the interaction that I have with the people I work with. The RSN is the smallest service and due to the nature of our work and working environment on board, we grow to become very close-knitted. These are the people that will keep you going when times are tough and challenging – cheering each other on and helping each other to achieve mission success. That family spirit, that sense of camaraderie and kinship are things that I believe are truly unique to the RSN.

What advice would you give to those who are looking to join the RSN?

The RSN is a dynamic and people-oriented environment. You will be entrusted with an important mission to safeguard our sea lines of communication – ensuring trade continues to flow for Singapore's survival and success. If you are looking for a unique, challenging, fulfilling and close-knitted working environment, the RSN is the right place for you!




